

What is the "Scotland in the EU" project about?

2025 is the 75th anniversary of the post-war Schuman Declaration which ultimately led to today's European Union. It was - and still is - essentially a peace project aiming to create a more united Europe, and thus avoid repetition of the devastation of two World Wars. 9th May – the date the Declaration was signed – is celebrated as 'Europe Day' every year across the countries of the EU.

To mark this anniversary in spring 2025, campaigners from Scotland and EU countries are collaborating to promote a better future for Scotland as an independent country in the European Union. To that end, in this project we are gathering views first-hand about Scotland from senior EU figures in Brussels, and then sharing these at public events in Scotland to inform discussion and debate about our potential EU future.

The project is taking place in the context of a strong grassroots pro-EU and pro-independence movement in Scotland, as well as major developments in the EU itself. In the 2016 Brexit referendum Scotland voted by a majority of 62% to Remain, but devolved nations' votes were deemed irrelevant to the overall UK result so Scotland was forced out of the EU due to the Leave majority in England. Now, polls show that Scots' support for a return to the EU is even stronger, at around 70% or above, and that support for independence would increase to a substantial majority if it were to lead to EU membership. But myths and misinformation spread by Brexiters and Eurosceptics mean that some Scots are still doubtful as to the feasibility of Scotland's EU accession, fearing barriers and negative attitudes from EU countries.

This project seeks to demonstrate that such fears are unfounded, and that we can be confident an application from independent Scotland to join the EU will be welcomed, as it will be good for Scotland – and good for Europe too.

MEPs from Austria, Germany, Italy, Spain & Sweden met the delegation in the European Parliament and were unanimous in welcoming Scotland's future EU accession.



Scotland in the EU: Good for Scotland?

Scotland is still the most pro-EU nation in the UK. Polls consistently show 70%+ of Scots want to be back in the EU, believing that Scotland would fare better in terms of trade, the economy, our voice in the world, the NHS and the gap between rich and poor, if we were part of the EU rather than the UK.

Almost every town and city in Scotland has at least one active 'Yes' group, i.e. pro-independence group. About 150 of these grassroots groups are affiliated to the national umbrella organisation Believe in Scotland, and most, including Yes for EU, are committed to EU membership upon gaining independence. A key driver of Scots' support for a return to the EU is the desire to restore Erasmus+ opportunities for young people.

Scotland in the EU: Good for Europe?

Scotland's return would reinforce the EU's democratic principles. With long-established civic institutions and values of social justice, as well as 47 years' EU experience during UK membership, Scotland will readily meet EU accession standards. With freedom of movement, its highly-educated workforce would revitalise academic and cultural exchanges and collaborations.

Scotland's vast renewable energy resources could play a key role in the EU's green transition. Its re-entry into the single market would boost trade. Geopolitically, Scotland's accession would help challenge the growth of the far-right in Europe and Putin's plan to weaken the EU.



Scotland's return is an opportunity to strengthen Europe's economy, democracy, and cohesion.

(1) the Brussels delegation

For the first stage of the "Scotland in the EU" project, a delegation from Scotland travelled to Brussels in April 2025 to meet with MEPs in the European Parliament. The group comprised members of Europe for Scotland (EfS) and Yes for EU, as well as former Scots MEPs Heather Anderson and Alyn Smith, and a media team. Each EU MEP had signed a pledge of support for Scotland:

I wish to express my solidarity with all Scottish citizens who were deprived of a vote in the EU election by Brexit.

I pledge to work in the European Parliament to ensure that any application from Scotland to rejoin the EU is welcomed with a spirit of friendship and solidarity.

I support the Scottish people's democratic will to be part of the EU, and believe they can help us build a better Europe.

(2) public meeting in Edinburgh on 9th May, Europe Day

This is the 2nd stage of the project — sharing the full story of the supportive voices from Brussels, and the warm welcome that awaits Scotland in the EU.



The 'Scotland in the EU' events are sowing the seeds of positive Scotland-EU relationships, and are prompting numerous interesting suggestions for nurturing these in future, for example:

- In Scotland, Yes for EU and Europe for Scotland will share the 'supportive voices' from Brussels widely in future events and social media, assuring the Scotlish public that there are no barriers to Scotland joining the EU once independent EU countries will welcome Scotland
- In the EU, some of the MEPs involved in this project will be attending crucial meetings, for example on the Trade & Cooperation Agreement - they will ensure that Scotland's voice is heard in Europe
- In the Scottish Parliament elections in May 2026 a pro-independence / pro-EU majority will be essential for securing progress towards Scottish independence and thus EU membership. Parties currently committed to joining the EU are the SNP and Scottish Greens; they can be encouraged to include the aim of EU membership in their manifestos
- A number of MEPs are keen to visit Scotland and talk about their support, in public events, media interviews, and meetings with politicians; this will create a visible record of EU support and interest for Scotland
